Description

This lot features a substantial collection of 47 Liberty Head "V" Nickels housed in a protective clear plastic tube with six examples displayed outside the container. Produced during the classic era of American coinage, this comprehensive accumulation represents a significant opportunity for collectors seeking to complete or enhance a Liberty Head Nickel set. The coins appear to include various years spanning multiple

decades of production, with visible examples from different periods of the series. Each nickel displays the iconic Charles E. Barber design with Liberty's classical profile surrounded by stars on the obverse and the distinctive Roman numeral "V" encircled by a wreath on the reverse. These five-cent pieces are struck in a copper-nickel alloy (75% copper, 25% nickel) and measure 21.2mm in diameter. The coins are presented in a convenient storage tube, making this an ideal starter collection or inventory lot for dealers. While individual years have not been fully inventoried, the quantity suggests a good possibility of finding better dates or mint marks among the 47 pieces.

Condition Notes:

All visible coins display moderate to heavy circulation wear consistent with having been in commerce, exhibiting the typical wear patterns on Liberty's hair and the stars. The overall appearance shows natural patina and toning ranging from light tan to darker gray-brown coloration. No obvious cleaning, damage, or alterations are evident on the displayed examples. The complete condition of all coins in the tube cannot be fully assessed without examination, but visible examples suggest consistent circulated grades throughout.
